Today's Epistle Reading

St. Paul's Letter to the Hebrews 11:24-26, 32-40

Brethren, by faith Moses, when he was grown up, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter, choosing rather to share ill-treatment with the people of God than to enjoy the fleeting pleasures of sin. He considered abuse suffered for the Christ greater wealth than the treasures of Egypt, for he looked to the reward.

And what more shall I say? For time would fail me to tell of Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, of David and Samuel and the prophets -- who through faith conquered kingdoms, enforced justice, received promises, stopped the mouths of lions, quenched raging fire, escaped the edge of the sword, won strength out of weakness, became mighty in war, put foreign enemies to flight. Women received their dead by resurrection. Some were tortured, refusing to accept release, that they might rise again to a better life. Others suffered mocking and scourging, and even chains and imprisonment. They were stoned, they were sawn in two, they were killed with the sword; they went about in skins of sheep and goats, destitute, afflicted, ill-treated -- of whom the world was not worthy -- wandering over deserts and mountains, and in dens and caves of the earth.

And all these, though well attested by their faith, did not receive what was promised, since God had foreseen something better for us, that apart from us they should not be made perfect.

Today's Gospel Reading

The Gospel According to John 1:43-51

At that time, Jesus decided to go to Galilee. And he found Philip and said to him, "Follow me." Now Philip was from Bethsaida, the city of Andrew and Peter. Philip found Nathanael, and he said to him, "We have found him of whom Moses in the law and also the prophets wrote, Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph." Nathanael said to him, "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" Philip said to him, "Come and see." Jesus saw Nathanael coming to him, and said of him, "Behold, an Israelite indeed, in whom is no guile!" Nathanael said to him, "How do you know me?" Jesus answered him, "Before Philip called you, when you were under the fig tree, I saw you." Nathanael answered him, "Rabbi, you are the Son of God! You are the King of Israel!" Jesus answered him, "Because I said to you, I saw you under the fig tree, do you believe? You shall see greater things than these." And he said to him, "Truly, truly, I say to you, you will see heaven opened, and the angels of God ascending and descending upon the Son of man."

Leaving a Legacy of Faith at All Saints Greek Orthodox Church

Planned giving is a thoughtful way to support the ministries and future of All Saints Greek Orthodox Church while also reflecting your faith, values, and stewardship. The following options allow parishioners to make a lasting gift—often with significant personal and tax benefits.

Bequests in a Will or Trust

A bequest is one of the simplest and most meaningful ways to make a planned gift. By including All Saints Greek Orthodox Church in your will or living trust, you can designate a specific dollar amount, a percentage of your estate, or the remainder after other gifts are fulfilled. Bequests can be updated at any time and do not affect your finances during your lifetime.

Beneficiary Designations

You may name All Saints as a beneficiary of certain financial accounts, such as: - Bank or brokerage accounts (Payable on Death / Transfer on Death) - Retirement accounts (IRA, 401(k), 403(b))

This is often as simple as completing a beneficiary form with your financial institution and can be revised if your circumstances change.

Retirement Account Gifts

Retirement assets are often heavily taxed when passed to heirs, but gifts to the Church may avoid these taxes. Naming All Saints as a full or partial beneficiary of a retirement account can be a tax-efficient way to support the Church's mission.

Life Insurance Gifts

You may choose to name All Saints Greek Orthodox Church as the beneficiary of an existing life insurance policy or donate a paid-up policy you no longer need. This allows you to make a meaningful future gift at a relatively modest cost.

Gifts of Appreciated Assets

Donating appreciated securities (such as stocks or mutual funds held for more than one year) may allow you to avoid capital gains tax while receiving a charitable deduction for the full market value of the gift. These gifts can support both current ministries or long-term needs.

Memorial or Legacy Gifts

Planned gifts may also be designated in memory of a loved one or as a legacy of faith for future generations. These gifts serve as a lasting witness to one's commitment to Christ and His Church.

A Prayerful Act of Stewardship

Planned giving is not about the size of the gift, but the intention behind it. It is an opportunity to give thanks to God for His blessings and to ensure that All Saints Greek Orthodox Church continues to serve, worship, and grow for generations to come.

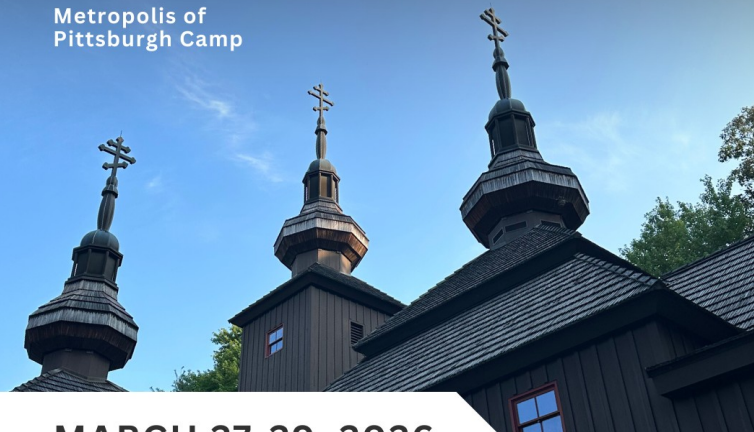
